## President's Message

It has been a busy few months since our last newsletter. I have been working on a number of projects I am excited to share with you.

The first is the addition of a group of post-docs to our union. Please look at the brief article below for more details. Adding members to strengthen our union gives us a stronger voice. Please join me in welcoming our new members.

The next project I will be working on is a joint effort with URFA geared towards having a Mental Health Policy and an improved Return to Work process.

We have, after numerous conversations with HR, finally resolved the issues with our vacation balances caused by the switchover in calculations from days to hours. The employer has recognized the error in how they were counting partial days, and it will be corrected to ensure that employees don't unfairly loose vacation time.

We are still waiting on bargaining dates with First Nations University, but I am hopeful we will meet before the end of the year.

Grievances remain high, but the employer has agreed to look into specific departments by performing interviews in toxic work environments on campus. We hope that this move will help to expedite a number of our outstanding concerns.

As an executive member of CUPE SK, I was asked to sit on an ad-hoc committee to decide if CUPE SK should affiliate with the NDP. I plan to bring the committee to our executive and local

for a presentation so that our members can make an informed decision.

Here is a brief list of events I will be attending in the next month:

- Oct 24-27- Saskatchewan Federation of Labour convention. Among many resolutions, there will be a motion to increase their per capita fee from a flat rate to a percentage.
- Nov 4-8- CUPE National Sector
   Conference. A major topic there will be violence and sexual violence in the workplace.
- The last two weeks of October I will also be present at all the area meetings. I look forward to the chance to meet with members in a small group setting. Bring your questions and concerns!

Lastly, I wanted to mention that the Christmas Social will be on Saturday, November the 24<sup>th</sup>. It is sure to be a good time, and I encourage all members to attend.

# **Local 5791 Welcomes 70 Members in New Bargaining Subunit**

Approximately 70 postdoctoral fellows and nonstudent researchers and technicians at the University of Regina voted 88% in favour of joining CUPE over the summer. The Saskatchewan Labour Relations Board issued a certification order for the new bargaining unit in August. In September the workers held their first union meeting and voted unanimously to join Local 5791 as a subunit, pending a vote of acceptance from the general membership. On October 10, members of Local 5791 voted to welcome the new bargaining unit at a general membership meeting. These new members will have their own bargaining committee and an Executive-At-Large on the 5791 local executive. We are happy to welcome these members and look forward to building our local together, increasing our solidarity and bargaining strength on campus.
